1. Research work

During the first semester of 1982, the Center for Folklore Studies conducted several researches in different areas of the country, in the fields of oral literature, festivals and ceremonies, folk medicine, ethnomusicology in compliance with the plan **general of Activities 1982.**

1.1 Oral literature

The Director and principal investigator (Lic. Celso A. Lara Figueroa, in charge of the literary folklore area), concluded the essay on "The popular literature of Guatemala, constants and variants. A big picture" for **Traditions of Guatemala** No. 18. In addition, the work continued **Folk tales of Guatemala. Second series**.

The Assistant Professor II (Claudia de los Ángeles Dary Fuentes, assistant of the literary folklore area), concluded the essay called 'The taboo of incest in the oral tradition of Guatemala' for the Magazine Tradiciones de Guatemala No. 17, He also prepared forty synopses of traditional tales for further analysis, study and interpretation. Likewise, fifty folk tales were classified according to the Stith Thompson and Antii-Aarne Motives and Types index, for further analysis and study. Its objective is to organize the archives of literary transcriptions of the area.

1.2 Traditional medicine

The assistant researcher (Licda. Elba Marina Villatoro, in charge of the area of Traditional Medicine), conducted an investigation about the healers of El Petén and prepared an article about it for The Popular Tradition No. 38. In addition, he initiated the preparation of a Compendium of Studies on Traditional Medicine in Guatemala, which will contain a series of articles on various topics on Traditional Medicine in Guatemala by various specialized authors on traditional medicine in the country and abroad.

The formation of a database on traditional medicine was also initiated in this area.

1.3 Ethnomusicology

The researcher in charge of the ethnomusicology area (Alfonso Arrivillaga Cortés) wrote an article called "Introduction to the History of musical instruments of the Guatemalan folk tradition" for The Folk Tradition No. 36. He also prepared the texts for the catalog of the Exhibition of musical instruments of the Guatemalan folk tradition (text of 51 pages, maps and photographs illustrating the temporary exhibition No. 6).

Note:

The person in charge of the area obtained a scholarship from the Organization of American States to do specialization studies in ethnomusicology at the Inter-American Institute of Ethnomusicology and Folklore (INIDEF), in Caracas, Venezuela, for a period of 8 months: April-November 1982.

According to the Fourth Point, paragraph 4.1 of the 11-82 Act dated April 23, 1982 of the Honorable University Superior Council, he was awarded a scholarship grant of 75% of his salary from the Center's budget. To replace the person in charge of the area during this period, the musicologist teacher Enrique Anleu Díaz was hired for two hours a day, who has continued with the work of the department. Their fees are covered with the remaining funds from the salary of Professor Arrivillaga Cortés (25%).

1.4 Other Investigations

The area of folklore applied to education, in addition to her teaching-research tasks, was concluded through the assistant researcher in charge of the area (Licda. Ofelia, Columba Déleon Meléndez), a diachronic and synchronous investigation on the subject of **The Jocotenango Fair in Guatemala City**, with the purpose of offering schoolchildren of the different levels of the educational system of the country, material to study the main festival of the city, both in its historical, social, as well as traditional, didactic and pedagogical aspects.

The essay resulting from this research will be published in the Short Collection of the Center for Folkloric Studies (in presses). In addition, the researcher in charge of the area carried out with the collaboration of the photographer of the Center (Prof. José Manuel Guerra Caravantes) an ethnographic and historical research (archive and newspaper library) about the Candlemas festival in the City of Guaternala whose final text will be published in The Popular Tradition No. 37.

Always within the field of social culture, the assistant researcher and the photographer covered the following festivals in Guatemala City: Esquipulas, Candelaria, Carnival, Holy Week, Day of the Cross and Corpus Christi.

3. Advocacy work

- **3.1.1 Exhibition on traditional aspects of Holy Week in Guatemala.** This exhibition was held from April 1 to 16 of this year, in collaboration with the School of History of the University of San Carlos and the Fray Francisco Vásquez Museum, at the headquarters of the latter museum.
- **3.1.2 Exhibition on musical instruments of the Guatemalan folk tradition.** From April to November of this year, the Center mounted an exhibition of musical instruments at its headquarters, for which it prepared a careful catalog.

3.1.2.1 Activities parallel to the exhibition

3.1.2.1.1 Targeted visits

Attention has been given to groups of students from different levels of the national educational system, lectures were given according to their educational level. During the months of April to June, 479 students were attended. This activity is in charge of Ofelia Déleon Meléndez assisted by Manuel Guerra Caravantes.

3.1.2.1.2 Traditional Music Recital

On June 18, a traditional music recital was presented by the musical group "Cakchiquel". During it, a didactic demonstration of the timbral sound and texture of some of the instruments of the Center's organological exhibition was offered.

4. Outreach work

4.1 Visits aimed at schoolchildren

During the first semester of 1982, the graduate Ofelia Columba Déleon Meléndez, gave several lectures on various folklore topics, during the Visits addressed to the **Center for Folklore Studies**, offered to schoolchildren from various public and private establishments in Guatemala City. The schoolchildren attended during this period were two hundred and ninety-six.

4.2 Talks and conferences

The graduates Celso A. Lara Figueroa, Ofelia Déleon Meléndez, Elba Marina Villatoro, the research assistant of the literary folklore area (Claudia Dary Fuentes) and the musicologist assistant in charge a.i. from the ethnomusicology area (Maestro Enrique Anleu Díaz) they have given lectures and talks and schools of the national educational system and institutions that have requested it on various topics of Guatemalan folklore.
